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Gate Automation FAQs

What is a gate automation system?

A gate automation system is a system where a gate opens and closes automatically without manual operation. It has a motor, sensors and a control system. Can be operated with a remote control, keypad, smartphone app or through sensors that detect vehicles or people approaching. [Gate automation systems are used for residential, commercial and industrial properties to increase security, convenience and access control.](#)

How much does a gate motor cost?

The cost of a gate motor varies depending on the type, brand and features. On average a gate motor can cost between £200 to £1,000 or more. Basic models for residential gates will be at the lower end of this range while heavy duty motors for larger or more complex gates will be more expensive. Additional costs will be for installation, accessories and maintenance.

How much does an electric gate cost in the UK?

The cost of an electric gate in the UK can vary greatly depending on the gate size, material, design and features. A basic single swing electric gate can cost between £1,000 to £3,000 while a double swing or sliding gate can cost between £2,000 to £7,000 or more. This will include the gate itself, the automation system and installation. Custom designs, premium materials and advanced features like intercoms or integrated security systems will add to the cost.

How does an automatic gate work?

An automatic gate works by using a motorised mechanism to open and close the gate without manual operation. Here's a general overview:

1. **Activation:** The gate is activated by a remote control, keypad, sensor or smartphone app.
2. **Motor Operation:** The motor (powered by electricity) opens or closes the gate. The type of motor depends on the type of gate (sliding, swinging or lifting).
3. **Control System:** The control system controls the gate movement, makes sure it opens and closes smoothly and stops when fully open or closed. May also have safety features like obstacle detection to prevent accidents.
4. **Sensors:** Sensors can detect vehicles or people approaching the gate and trigger the opening or closing.
5. **Safety Mechanisms:** Automatic gates have safety mechanisms like infrared sensors or pressure sensitive edges to prevent the gate from closing on a vehicle, person or object.
