

What's the difference Between a Recycling Baler and a Waste Compactor?

Recycling Baler

A [Recycling Baler](#), also commonly known as a Waste Baler is a machine that can compact recyclable materials into solid blocks called bales. Typically there are two types of Baler; vertical and horizontal but we also supply semi-automatic, twin ram and specialist balers.



[Balers](#) allow you to compact multiple streams of dry waste such as paper, cardboard, plastic and more. Material is loaded into the chamber, and the compaction plate compacts and compresses the recyclables. This process is repeated until a full bale is created and then subsequently tied and ejected. Bales are easily stackable and transported, therefore they're easy to collect and transport to recycling centers. As the bale consists solely of recycled material it typically has a value and at certain size bales and volume you can generate revenue. The compaction process minimises the amount of volume these materials require, keeping your workplace tidy.

Waste Compactors

Waste compactors are commonly used by organisations that have medium to large volumes of low-value mixed waste. Typically, Waste Compactors come in three models, static, portable and specialist. However, the underlying concept remains the same. They're designed to compress waste to reduce the volume of space it requires. In turn, fewer waste collections are required, which leads to cost savings. In order to complete this task compactors deploy a powerful compaction ram that delivers up to 36 tonnes of force.



Ensuring all of your waste is fully compacted enables your business to stop paying for fresh air and to reduce void space. Paying to collect half-full bins is a waste of money for your business and isn't cost-efficient or good for the environment.

Compactor Benefits

- Achieve a 5:1 compaction ratio

In summary, both machines aim to minimise the amount of space waste takes up. However, they typically both process different materials. [Balers](#) are perfect for compacting dry waste recyclables such as cardboard, paper, and plastic. If your business produces a sufficient stream of these materials then a Baler could be a suitable option. If your business produces a high volume of mixed general waste then a [Compactor](#) may be required.

What type and volume of waste does your business dispose of?

If your business disposes of large amounts of dry recyclables such as paper or cardboard then a [Baler](#) will be the best option. This will allow you to compact and bale the material and dispose of it for free, or even generate revenue.

If on the other hand your business mostly produces low-value mixed waste then a [Waste Compactor](#) will be a great option. This will ensure any waste is fully compacted before being collected. Therefore, you'll require fewer collections, in turn, saving your business money.

How much space do you have available?
