- **30** indicates how the oil handles heat, specifically at around 100 °C.

Many generators recommend 10W-30, but always check the manual to avoid poor lubrication or engine wear.

Factor in Operating Temperatures

Different oils perform better under varying environmental conditions:

- **SAE 30** is generally suited to temperatures above 0 °C.
- **10W-30** works well between approximately -10 °C and +40 °C.
- **Synthetic 5W-30** offers flexibility across a broad range of temperatures, though it may deplete quickly in high-temperature settings.

Know Your Engine Type: 2-Stroke vs 4-Stroke

Generators typically come with either a 2-stroke or 4-stroke engine:

- **2-stroke engines** require oil to be mixed with the fuel, or you might use a premixed fuel/oil blend.
- **4-stroke engines** use oil and fuel separately, like a traditional car engine.

Understanding this distinction ensures you're choosing the correct oil system for your machine.
