All you need is a full car licence, being fit to drive and obtain your provisional HGV to can start training, and then a Driver Certificate of Professional Competence (CPC) card and you will be ready to start work.
- **The opportunity to travel.** As a HGV driver, you can explore different parts of the UK and even other countries if you drive internationally. You can enjoy the scenery, meet new people, and experience different cultures. And depending on your job, you may also be able choose the routes and destinations that suit your preferences and lifestyle.
- **Excellent career progression – Logistics is an Expanding Industry.** There are different types of HGV licences depending on the size and type of vehicle you want to drive. You can start with a category C1 licence for medium-sized lorries and then upgrade to a category LGV C (HGV 2) licence for large rigid lorries or a category C+E licence for large articulated lorries. OR, You could go straight from a Car licence to LGV C+E (HGV Class 1) You can also specialise in different sectors, such as refrigerated transport, hazardous goods such as fuel deliveries, or livestock transport.
- **The possibility of becoming self-employed.** If you want more freedom and control over your work, you can become a self-employed HGV driver or an owner-operator. This means you can set your own rates, choose your own clients, and manage your own schedule. However, you will also have to deal with more responsibilities, such as taxes, insurance, and maintenance.

As you can see, getting a HGV licence can open up many opportunities and advantages for you.
